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Calling 911 -- Many cell phones don't get service, but there is a phone for emergency use in the farmhouse. Make sure to notify camp staff if 911 needs to be called or has been called. The camp is on the Tuscarora Creek on Rt. 850. The camp address is:

(Please take note: This address, if put into GPS, will not bring you to the camp. It shows up around the bend on 850 northwest of camp past the elementary school. Directions to Camp

Special note for 2023: The route 75 bridge in Port Royal will be closed through August.

From the Northeast/Interstate 80 - Take Lewisburg exit Rt. 15 south, which runs into Rt. 11 and 15 through Selinsgrove. Take Rt. 35 South on the south side of Selinsgrove. Stay on Rt35 through Mifflintown and under Rt. 322 East. Continue on Rt 35 approximately 15 miles to RT 850 East. Travel .3½ miles to the camp. Do NOT cross the bridge over the Tuscarora creek. *Visit the Camp webpage for specific directions and maps.*

From 322 Pick up Rt 35S at Mifflintown and follow the instructions above.

'Slow' Route from Harrisburg Interstate 83 – Cross the Susquehanna on 83 West. Stay left and follow PA-581 W. Exit left onto 81S (1B) and take the next right exit onto PA-114W. Turn left onto PA 944. In 3.4 miles stay straight onto Sunnyside Dr. At the traffic circle, use the second exit for Spring Rd Rt34. At the second traffic circle, stay on Rt 34 and pickup 850W. At Drumgold's Corner, turn left to follow 850W for approximately 25 miles. At Honey Grove, turn right onto 75N and then left to stay on 850W. The camp will be approximately 1½ miles on the right, shortly after the Tuscarora creek bridge.

From the PA Turnpike - Take exit 189 to Route 75 North (approximately 25 miles). Make a left onto Route 850 West and go approximately 1½ miles to the property on the right after the Tuscarora creek bridge. Look for Royal Ranger signs. *Visit the Camp webpage for specific directions and maps.*

Area Stores – There is a small grocery store (East Waterford) five miles from camp that carries basic needs. Several larger grocery stores are located about a 30 to 40 minute drive from camp.

General (Camp) Store - a favorite spot for campers to relax with a cool drink or a famous root beer float. Also, check out the most recent Royal Ranger items and apparel offered by the District. Complete meals will not be served, but a variety of sandwiches and snacks will be available. Drinks of all types including water and coffee will be served.

Photos will be taken of all Powwow activities. Persons attending or visiting Powwow may be photographed. These photos may be used for promotional material including posting on the Penn-Del Royal Rangers website. Any person not wanting his/her picture used must notify the Penn-Del District Director in writing prior to the Powwow. No photos or videos may be sold for any reason without the written consent of the Penn-Del Royal Rangers.

Facilities: Shower facilities are not available at camp. Consider bringing portable camp showers for your site. Portable toilets are available and will be conveniently located. Potable Water is available however bringing a supply with you will help. Firewood for cooking and campfires should be brought to camp with you. The Amphitheater used for evening services does not have permanent seating. Bring portable chairs for assemblies.

Swimming in the stream during daylight hours is permitted. The average water depth is approximately two to three feet with deeper spots in places. Boys must wear appropriate swimwear. Sturdy shoes must be worn at all times when in the stream. No water shoes or sandals. For safety reasons an adult outpost leader or chaperone MUST escort the boys at all times.

Meals – Outposts are encouraged to purchase meals when they register. We will try to accommodate late registrants but can't guarantee we will have meals.

Frontiersman Camping Fellowship will have a working village demonstrating frontier skills. Members are encouraged to participate at Powwow. Bring your shelters, skills and exhibits to show future FCF'ers what the fellowship is all about.



BGMC Special Offering – Please come prepared for a BGMC offering for missions.

Pastors are welcome and encouraged to attend or visit during Powwow.



Refund/Registration Policy: Fees will be refunded by contacting Steve Steffel no later than June 15th at (302) 832-8919 or (302) 379-1580 (cell). Refunds will not be available after this date. Substitutions can be made but please have the information “Ready” when arriving at Powwow so you can move quickly through registration.

Ranger Kids Day registration includes awards and activities. The weekend registration fee will apply to Ranger Kids camping the weekend (when accompanied by dad or relative). The Ranger Kids will be having a coloring contest. The contest pictures and rules will be posted on the District Powwow webpage and can be downloaded.

Visitor Registration: All visitors must register including ladies and girls. Visitors will be permitted on the grounds and in the campsites during visiting hours. Visitors may attend the evening services. Female guests will not be permitted in the campsite after visiting hours. **Any adult visitor must have up to date background checks on file at the associated church and a “Leaders/Adult Event Recommendation from Pastoral Staff” form for the event.**

Visiting Hours: Visitors are welcome from 8 am to 6 pm and during the evening services. Please have the appropriate form.

Volunteers: Royal Ranger Alumni, Men’s Groups, former Royal Ranger leaders, pastors, and others have been very helpful conducting activities. This allows Commanders to be with their boys. Please encourage these helpful men to attend. Volunteers serving throughout the PowWow need to register have up to date forms and would pay for meals and will also receive a patch. The events are planned but we certainly can use many volunteers to make the activities and meals a success.

Awards and Competitions

Outpost Of The Year Award (OOTY) will be awarded for top honors. The "OOTY" will be determined based upon participation at Powwow as described below. See if your outpost can walk away with this year’s "Outpost of the Year" honors.

Uniform Inspection, Campsite Inspection and Event Participation are required to qualify for the Outpost Of The Year (OOTY).

Uniform Inspection points will be earned according to the enclosed Uniform Inspection sheet. The Utility and Specialty uniforms will be the primary uniforms inspected. Dress uniform will be inspected if requested. A possible 100 points can be earned. With the variety of Utility and Specialty uniforms points earned will be based on the uniformity of the outpost.

Campsite Inspection is required to be eligible for the OOTY. Each Outpost turning in a form will have its campsite inspected. Campsites should be kept in good order and ready for inspection to earn the maximum points. Each Outpost must have a sign or banner that clearly identifies its campsite. Campsite inspection will be based upon the enclosed “Campsite Inspection” sheet.

Activity Participation is also required to qualify for the OOTY. Outpost will receive credits by participating in the planned activities. Points from the above inspections will be tallied to determine if an Outpost receives the blue, red or yellow Outpost Excellence Award.

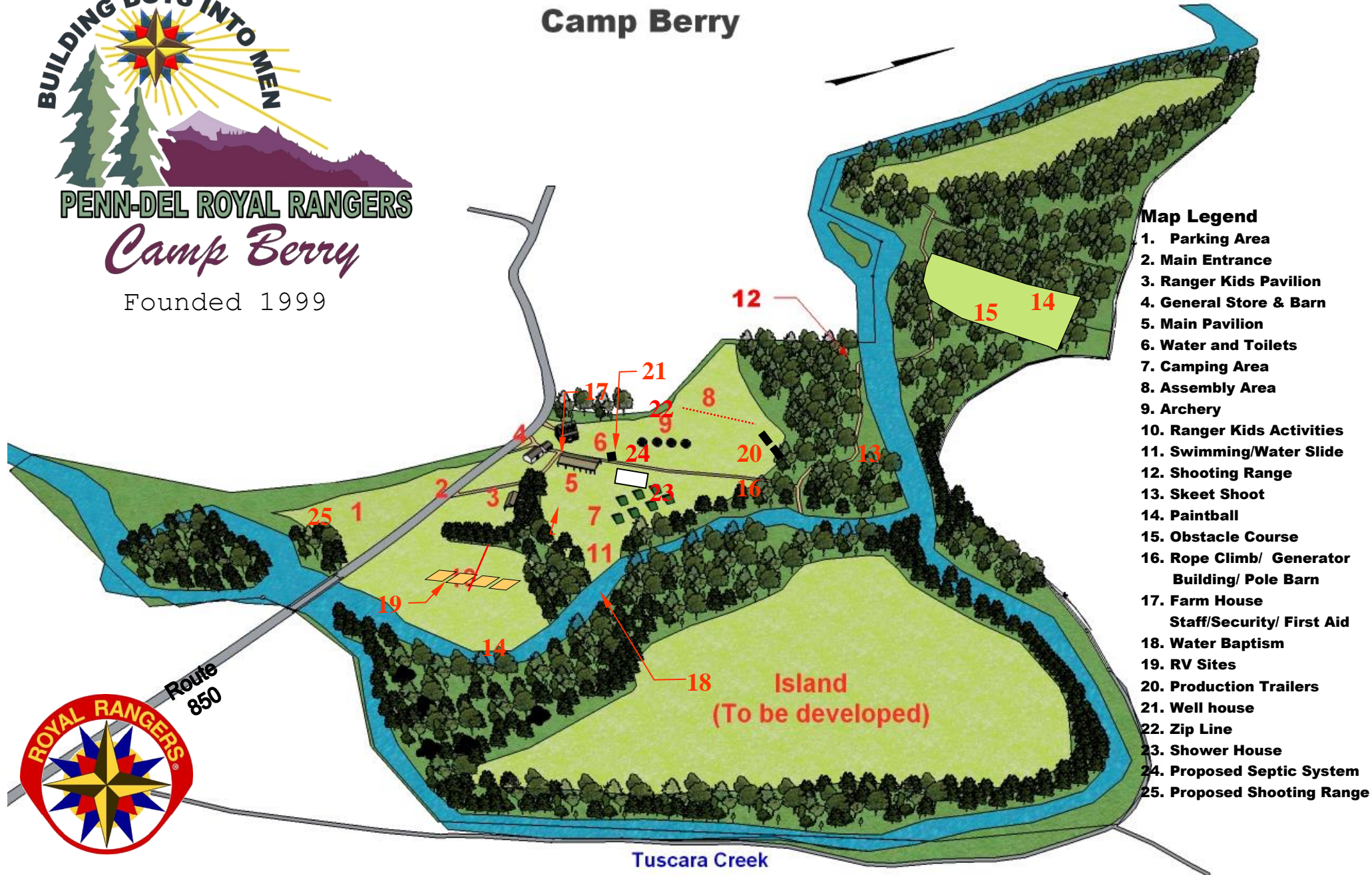
Powwow is a great and enjoyable experience. To make this event pleasant and safe for all please instruct your outpost to follow the directions. Infractions will be reported to the Powwow Coordinator and appropriate disciplinary actions may follow. Powwow Security will enforce the following rules:

- Outpost leadership is responsible for the safety, health well being, and conduct of their boys. Commanders; know where your boys are at all times.
- The enclosed "Leaders/Adult Event Recommendation from Pastoral Staff" must be submitted for every adult attending. Pastors signature is required.
- All adult visitors will need to stop in at registration (or store) and provide the above form.
- Leaders or Adult Chaperones taking boys off the Powwow grounds must complete *Event Release and Hold Harmless Agreement* prior to leaving the grounds (at the store).
- No pets are allowed. ATV's are not permitted except for security.
- Please burn all burnable items and bag the non-burnable. Additional direction will be given during Powwow. Place litter in the proper waste containers. Leave your campsite better than you found it.
- Rock throwing, alcoholic beverages, smoking, cursing, or fireworks are not permitted. Violators may be removed from the grounds and their registration fee will not be refunded.
- No washing of pots, pans, dishes or personal hygiene in the stream or at the water dispensing areas. Practice water conservation. Commanders, please convey the importance of not wasting water. Water will be available at camp, but bringing a supply along will help.
- Outposts are expected to attend all assemblies. Anyone remaining in the outpost camp area without permission from the Powwow Coordinator during an assembly or activity will cost the outpost points. Please be on time for all programs and services. Security will limit traffic during services.
- Do not cut live trees or saplings unless approved by Powwow Coordinator or Security.
- Lashing materials should be brought with you.
- KNIVES are to be used by boys with current Tool Safety cards. Knives are not to be displayed or worn openly. Outpost commanders are responsible for their boys using, buying, or swapping knives.
- SWIMMING RULES – You may enjoy a cool dip in the stream; however, all Rangers (under age 18) must be escorted by adult outpost leadership. Jumping, diving, or excessive horseplay is not permitted. We want boys to have fun, but safety is the priority. Wear proper swimming apparel. Sturdy shoes must be worn at all times when in the stream. No water shoes or sandals.
- Keep rest rooms and campsites neat and clean.
- The farm house is off limits for the boys. Please ask security for permission to enter.
- For individual safety and insurance reasons all accidents and injuries must be reported to the Health and Safety officer.
- Fire pits must be made by carefully digging out the turf, then carefully replacing the turf when done. Left over wood must be put in the firewood pile. Fires in campsites must be attended at all times.
- For safety reasons the National Royal Ranger office has stipulated that only propane stoves and lanterns are permitted.
- Please observe quiet times. Have respect for those camping near you.
- Vehicles are to be moved to the designated parking areas after unloading. Trailers will be permitted if they are a functional part of the campsite.
- In the event of severe storm or emergency conditions follow the direction of security and emergency personal.
- Weapons are prohibited unless approved by the District Commander or the Powwow Coordinator and only for display purposes. Displays must be cleared by the District Commander. No live ammunition is permitted.
 - Ladies will be permitted in campsites during visiting hours and may help with meal preparation.
